


- 3,424,593 families or 16,078,181 individuals affected (890,895 families or 4,095,280 individuals displaced
- 1,084,762 houses damaged (partially damaged are 595,149 and totally damaged are 489,613).
- Total damage is estimated to total PhP 89.6 billion (or EUR 1.5 billion)



6,300 people died (National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee, 17 April 2014)

## SAMMIEmergency-Phil-13

- Relief and Rebuilding of Typhoon Yolanda affected communities in San Jose, Tacloban City
  - Transportation of medical and relief supplies
  - Relief assistance and home and community reconstruction materials
  - Psychosocial care and community spaces for children
  - Livelihood support
  - Community-based disaster risk reduction and preparation mechanisms

## MAGEmergency2-Phil-13

- Emergency and Relief Assistance to survivors of Typhoon
   Yolanda in Hamorawon and Banaag, Manicani Island
- 10.500 from the Lower Saxony State Chancellery and 500 from tdh HUHI funds
- Provision of relief assistance and transport to 2 out of the 4 focus villages in the island of Manicani (provision of food and non-food items
- Status: completed

#### FTCEmergency-Phil-13

- Project partner: Feed the Children
- Interventions:
  - Setting up of feeding stations and training of 3 team members of local implementing partners for actual conduct of feeding activities.
- Status: Extended until15 July 2014





#### GAIAEmergency-Phil-14

- <u>Interventions</u>:
  - Repair of damaged houses

  - Project Pag-aram: school supplies for students and teachers
